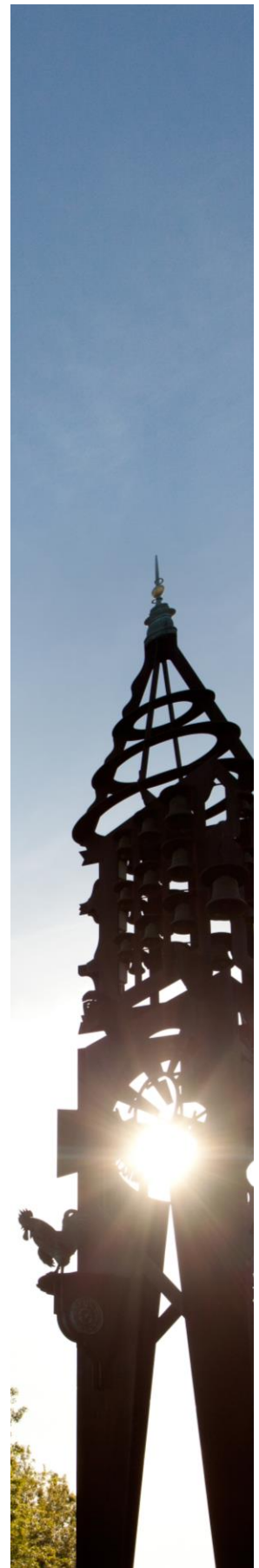

- Primary teaching responsibilities include theory instruction and lab/clinical supervision.

- Flexible to teach day and evening sections.

Minimum Qualifications:*Education Requirement*

- Bachelor's degree in medical technology.

Occupational Experience Requirement

- Two full-time years (or equivalent) of verified related paid work experience as a medical laboratory technologist.

Recency Requirement

- One year of this work experience shall be within the five years immediately preceding the date of application for the credential field. The recency requirement shall be waived if the individual has two years of successful full-time (or equivalent) postsecondary teaching experience in the credential field within the last five years.

Professional Requirement

- Medical Laboratory Technologist certification by one of the following: American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP), National Credentialing Agency for Laboratory Personnel (NCA), American Association of Bioanalysts (AAB), or American Medical Technologists (AMT).

Preferred Qualifications:

- Master's degree in medical technology.
- Current theory instruction and clinical experience in medical laboratory desired.
- Experience in online teaching or demonstrated willingness to learn and develop online courses.
- Experience with learner outcomes assessment and evaluation.
- Demonstrated ability to educate adult learners, students of color, students with disabilities, and international students.
- Proficient in Microsoft Office applications (Word, Excel, PowerPoint).
- Flexibility to teach daytime and evening sections.
- Exceptional team player who is willing to devote time to students and the department.
- Working knowledge of alternative instructional techniques and delivery methods such as online education, education platforms (D2L Brightspace), digital technology, etc.

Salary:

Under the collective bargaining agreement with the Minnesota State College Faculty (MSCF), new faculty to the system receive a salary placement based on education and related experience after a job offer is accepted. Entry-level range is \$43,503 - \$62,301 for a nine-month academic year. The maximum salary at hire is \$62,301 per academic year, depending on education and experience.
